



Report: Study Lists Nevada's Most Dangerous Intersections

Some scary statistics came out this week regarding dangerous roadways and intersections across Nevada.

"We are asking everybody to listen, legislators, motorists, engineers, not just one group, it's a community wide issue," says AAA Nevada spokesman Michael Geeser.

Geeser joined researchers out of Washington, D.C. to release the report on Thursday.

The "Getting Home Safely" study listed 60 roads and intersections with the highest rates of serious accidents over the past year.

In Washoe County, areas that made the list include McCarran Boulevard and Pyramid Highway, Oddie Boulevard at Sullivan Lane, Oddie at El Rancho Drive and part of U.S. 395 north.

Researchers say all of us can play a part in making our roads safer, from motorists making better decisions to legislators putting in more money to improve our roads. "Anything that makes the driving environment easier to be interpreted by motorists allows drivers who make errors to quickly correct those errors is going to tremendously improve traffic here in Nevada," says Frank Moretti of Trip Research Group.

Researchers say even though traffic fatalities in 2007 went down overall in Nevada, that number actually went up here in northern Nevada.
