## HARTFORD MOTORISTS LOSE NEARLY \$2,400 PER YEAR ON ROADS THAT ARE DETERIORATED, CONGESTED & LACK SOME NEEDED SAFETY FEATURES

**WHAT:** The average driver in the Hartford urban area loses nearly \$2.400 annually as a result of

driving on roads that are deteriorated, congested, and that lack some desirable safety features, according to a new report from <u>TRIP</u>, a national nonprofit transportation research group based in Washington, DC. Local speakers will join TRIP on Tuesday to highlight the

findings and discuss possible solutions.

The report, Connecticut Transportation by the Numbers: Meeting the State's Need for Safe and Efficient Mobility, examines road and bridge conditions, congestion, economic development, highway safety, and transportation funding in Connecticut. In addition to statewide information, the report contains regional data for Bridgeport-Stamford, Hartford

and New Haven.
