NEW REPORT IDENTIFIES LEHIGH VALLEY-READING AREA'S MOST EXPENSIVE COMMUTES AND CALCULATES COST TO AVERAGE DRIVERS OF TRAVELING ON EACH CONGESTED ROUTE

A new report that identifies the most congested corridors and their cost to commuters in the Lehigh Valley will be released on Thursday, June 20. The report is being released by <u>TRIP</u>, a national nonprofit transportation research group based in Washington, DC.

The report, "The Region's Most Expensive Commutes: Congested Corridors in the Lehigh Valley-Reading Area and the Steps Needed to Relieve Traffic Congestion," identifies the 10 congested corridors that cost area commuters the most in lost time and fuel and outlines a comprehensive set of strategies to help relieve traffic congestion and enhance transportation reliability in the state. TRIP's report calculates that traffic congestion costs Lehigh Valley-Reading area travelers approximately \$410 million annually in the value of wasted time and fuel. Some area commutes cost individual motorists as much as \$2,639 annually or \$51 weekly – including an additional 143 hours stuck in traffic per year. TRIP will also be releasing similar reports in the state's largest urban areas, including Harrisburg-York-Lancaster, Philadelphia, Pittsburgh and Scranton/Wilkes-Barre.
