Oh Boy!

To the recent report showing Mississippi's rural roads to be among the worst in the nation. The findings by TRIP, a national transportation research group, lists Mississippi tied with New Mexico for fifth among the 50 states. In each state, 25 percent of the rural roads are in poor condition under criteria used for the report. Mississippi is the only Mid-South state in the top 5. The report finds that Mississippi also has the fourth highest percentage nationally of traffic fatalities on its rural, non-interstate roads.
