NEW REPORT IDENTIFIES UTAH'S TOP TRANSPORTATION PROJECTS NEEDED TO SUPPORT ECONOMIC GROWTH AND QUALITY OF LIFE

A new report that identifies the transportation improvements most needed to support Utah's economic growth and quality of life will be released at a news conference in Salt Lake City at 10:00 a.m. on Tuesday, March 3. The report is being released by [TRIP](http://tripnet.org), a national nonprofit transportation research group based in Washington, DC.

The report, "*Utah's Most Critical Surface Transportation Projects to Support Economic Growth and Quality of Life*," identifies the improvements of the state's roadway, bridge and transit system that are most needed to foster the state's economic growth and support a high quality of life.

Carolyn Bonifas Kelly, TRIP's associate director of research and communication, will present the findings of the report at the news conference. Local speakers will be on hand to comment on the report.
